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

#### **DIRECTIONS TO OFF-SITE EVENTS**

All walking directions begin at the 5th Street Hilton entrance. Locations are also on the downtown map, pages 16-17.

Christ Church Cathedral (A), 318 East 4<sup>th</sup> Street (Choral Evensong). Go east (right) one block to Vine Street; turn right (south) onto Vine Street; Turn left (east) onto 4<sup>th</sup> Street. The church will be on the left side of 4<sup>th</sup> street three blocks after you cross Sycamore Street.

Covenant Presbyterian Church (B), 717 Elm Street (High School Honor Choir rehearsals). Go west (left) one block to Elm Street; turn right (north) onto Elm Street; Covenant Presbyterian will be on the left side of the street between 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> streets. Once you are on Elm Street, it is 2 ½ blocks (north).

*The Phoenix (C)*, 812 Race Street (President's Reception - by invitation only). Make an immediate right onto Race Street. Walk approximately three blocks north to the Phoenix restaurant. The entrance to the restaurant is on 9<sup>th</sup> Street. Turn right onto 9<sup>th</sup> from Race Street.

*St. Peter in Chains (D)*, 325 West 8<sup>th</sup> Street (Chanticleer Concert). Use the Covenant Presbyterian Church directions but continue (north) to 8<sup>th</sup> Street. Turn left onto 8<sup>th</sup> Street. The church will be straight ahead one block.





Music tailored to fit your choir: Repertoire solutions for mixed choirs with fewer males - Philip Silvey, presenter. Stephen Popa, presiding. Rosewood Room

This session will address issues of imbalance encountered by teachers whose mixed choirs have significantly more females than males. The presenter will offer practical approaches to music selection and voice part distribution. 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

By Women, for Women: Choral Works for Women's Voices, Composed and Texted by Women - Shelbie Wahl, Noblesville IN, presenter. R. Brett Goad, Illinois CDA, presiding. Rosewood Room

Throughout history, men have composed quality works for women's voices that are well-represented in repertoire lists, concert programs, and available recordings. What about works by women composers, or those with texts by women authors? What about music written by women, for women? This interest session will assist conductors in the programming of a wide variety of quality repertoire by women composers and poets.



Shelbie L. Wahl received a Doctor of Arts in Choral Conducting from Ball State University, with a secondary degree emphasis in Music Education. Wahl conducted the Ball State Women's Chorus, served as Assistant Conductor of the Chamber and Concert Choirs, and taught introductory conducting. She holds an MM in Choral Conducting from Butler University and is musical director and conductor at Indianapolis Civic Theatre.

Telemann's Choir: Evidence of Ensemble Size from Original Performing Parts -Brian T. Russell, presenter. Scott Buchanan, Indiana CDA President, presider. Rookwood Room

One of the most heated scholarly debates of the last 30 years has concerned the size of Johann Sebastian Bach's performance forces in his sacred vocal repertoire. Examining the music of Bach's friend and contemporary, Georg Philipp Telemann, will elucidate the accepted practices of the day from a composer whose reputation



spread far beyond the reaches of the Leipzig borders. This session will examine Telemann's psalms and motets, looking for clues as to the number of singers and instrumentalists he likely employed.

Brian T. Russell is Assistant Professor of choral music education at Illinois Wesleyan University, where he teaches courses in Music Education, directing the University Choir, and supervising student teachers. He holds his graduate degrees in conducting from the Eastman School of Music and Bachelor of Music Education from Middle Tennessee State University, with research interests of Baroque performance practice, recently manifested in critical editions and the American premiere of seven heretofore unpublished psalm settings by Telemann.

**Rehearsal: It's Why We Get Paid** (session 1) - Brad Holmes, Decatur IL, clinician. Laura Lane, Galesburg IL, presiding. Continental Ballroom

The *Collegiate Repertoire Chorale* will expose singers to new repertoire and techniques within a collaborative context. The choir will be led through a range of musics exploring a variety of choral sonorities, experimenting with techniques suitable to the creation of these sounds. The format allows for an upbeat and energetic pace without the concerns of performance.



Brad Holmes has overseen the growth of the choral program at Millikin University to five choirs and a variety of smaller vocal ensembles. Under his direction, the Millikin University Choir has performed for division and the national conferences. His guest conducting schedule in 35 countries has included festivals, church music clinics and All-State choirs. In 2000, he was inducted as a Visiting Fellow into Wolfson College, Cambridge University, England.





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

Help the Boys Sing Through the Change: Adolescent Repertoire Through the "Expanding Voice Method" Lens - Charles P. Brown, River Forest IL, presenter. 



She has also served as an accompanist for OCDA reading sessions, OMEA all-state choirs, Hal Leonard's Joy of Singing workshops and Show Choir Camps of America. She currently is putting her experience to work part-time in the choral department at Stanton's Sheet Music in Columbus.

## *High School Mixed Honor Choir*, Edith Copley, conductor; William Buhr, accompanist

Edith A. Copley is Professor of Music and Director of Choral Studies at Northern Arizona University, where she conducts the Shrine of the Ages Choir and teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting and graduate choral literature. Choirs under her direction have performed at state, division and national conferences of ACDA and MENC and have toured internationally to Western Europe, the People's Republic of China.

Equally at home on the stages of the world's most prestigious concert halls or in the world of musical theater, his musical partnerships are numerous and richly varied. He has served on the accompanying staff of the Chicago Symphony Chorus at the invitation of founder/director Margaret Hillis, and has accompanied James Levine, Michael Tilson Thomas, Yo-Yo Ma, June

Anderson, Berndt Weikl and others at the Ravinia Festival. Holding degrees from the University of Illinois and DePaul University, Buhr has appeared in many international festivals as well as numerous national and regional conventions of major musical and educational organizations. Buhr has served on the faculty of the Choral Music Experience Institute for Choral Teacher Education with Doreen Rao since its inception in 1986, and has played for the national touring companies of numerous Broadway musicals including *Showboat*, Disney's *Beauty and the Beast*, and *The Phantom of the Opera*. He has served as the Associate Director and accompanist of the New Classic Singers, the resident professional choral ensemble at the College of DuPage since 1986, and has enjoyed an association with Anima - Young Singers of Greater Chicago since 1984.
